Flatwater racing Day Four Semi-finals report and photographs

Beijing - The final day of flatwater racing semi-finals was completed under grey skies and steady drizzle at the Shunyi Olympic Rowing-Canoeing Park, with a number of surprise results littering the results sheet as big names were dethroned by eager kayakers and canoeists desperate to keep their Olympic medal dreams alive.

200m K1 world champion Jonas Ems couldn't reproduce his form from earlier in the competition, and together with the strong Pole Marek Twardowski was eliminated in the men's 500m K1 semi-final sensationally won by New Zealand's Steven Ferguson, with British 1000m world champion Tim Brabants grabbing the last place in the final.

"It wasn't easy," said Ferguson, whose father Ian won kayaking Olympic medals in 1980 and 1984. "There was a good headwind. I just wanted to get my knuckles into the race and grind through."

In the third semi-final Croatian Stjepan Janic, the older brother of Hungarian woman's racing superstar Natasa Janics, set the fastest time in all three men's 500m semi-finals in a race that also saw Norway's Eirik Veraas Larsen and Hungary's Akos Vereckei into Saturdays final.

In the first of the three semi-finals Adam Van Koeverden posted a confident victory in a race that saw South African Shaun Rubenstein dealt a carbon-copy elimination of his fourth place in Wednesday's 1000m semi-final, as he finished behind the Canadian and Russia Anton Ryakhov and Australian Ken Wallace.

There was even more drama in the men's C1 semi-finals, where the defending Olympic champion Andreas Dittmer was eliminated in a heat dominated from the outset by the tough Ukrainian Iurii Cheban, and a fast finishing Mathieu Goubel and local hero Li Qiang, who kept the packed stands cheering despite the inclement weather.

"I didn't feel 100 percent fit," said Dittmer. "I'm not sure if the problem is in my training. It's the first time I havent made the final."

In the other Mens C1 500m semi-final Hungary's Attila Vajda posted the days fastest men's C1 500m time as he raced into Saturday's final with Florin Georgian Mironcic of Romania and Poland's Pawel Baraszkiewicz, with Canadian Mark Oldershaw's final desperate efforts on the line resulting in him capsizing his canoe.

"My start was the best," said Vajda. "I was concentrating on my start because in my heat I had a bad start. After 250m I was in the first three and I was able to relax."

In the women's competition Inna Osypenko-Radomska produced a gutsy display that signalled her intention to seriously challenge for a medal with a very fast victory in the first women's 500mm K1 semi-final, with Lucy Wainwright and Jen Hodson securing the balance of the places in the final.

In the other women's 500m K1 semi-final China's Hongyan Zhong produced a popular victory that also saw Russia's Yuliana Salakhova and Slovenia's Spela Ponomarenko wrap up berths in the final.

The Canadian crew of Richard Dober Jr and Andrew Willows led home the Polish crew of Marek Twardomski and Adam Wysocki and Danes Kim Wraae Knudsen and Rene Holten Poulsen in the men's 500m K2 semi-final. "It is a good thing that we have come through this process," said Willows. "It's important that we get back into sync as we haven't raced for a while."

The Japanese women's crew of Shinobu Kitamoto and Mikiko Takeya posted a runaway victory in the women's 500m K2 semi-final.

The first of the finals gets under way on Friday afternoon.
